**SPITTERS AND FILLET PLANTS
HAVE PLENTY OF STOCK
TODAY.**

Splitters and filleting plants had plenty of fish for today, several nice fares having been brought down from Boston and landed direct from the grounds since yesterday.

Sch. Wanderer with about 100,000 pounds of fresh fish arrived yesterday afternoon and tied up at the Booth Fisheries Company plant to take out. Sch. John J. Fallon with 126,000 pounds also came down from Boston during the afternoon, taking out a portion of her trip at the Gorton-Pew filleting plant and sending the rest to the Gorton wharf to split. The baby trawler Amherst, with 100,000 pounds, arrived during the night for the General Seafoods Corporation, and the dragger Ruth Lucille for the same concern, took out a 45,000 pound trip yesterday afternoon.

There were a few seiners in with mackerel and bullseyes. Overland receipts of 200,000 pounds of fresh fish swelled the day's receipts. Gill netters brought in around 35,000 pounds of fish yesterday afternoon.

HEAVY RECEIPTS OF MACKEREL

**SEINERS HAVE 451,000 POUNDS
AT BOSTON PIER—PRICES
ARE LOWER.**

A fleet of 21 seiners headed the list at the Boston fish pier this morning and receipts were the heaviest for several days, totalling 451,000 pounds of fresh mackerel. There were 14 others on hand at the opening and groundfish was available in abundance, too, the fares aggregating 914,000 pounds of groundfish and 51,000 pounds of mixed fish. Prices were lower.

FAIR AMOUNT OF FISH HERE

**SEINER BROUGHT MACKEREL
FARE FROM BOSTON TO
SPLIT YESTERDAY.**

A fair amount of fresh fish was landed here yesterday afternoon and this morning, including one trip of mackerel. Sch. Laura Goulart arrived from Boston early last evening with a fare of 100,000 pounds of fresh fish for the Gorton-Pew Company, which went to split. Boat St. Peter brought down 60,000 pounds of fresh mackerel from Boston yesterday afternoon, the trip going to Frank C. Pearce Company. Overland receipts from Boston amounted to 100,000 pounds, and gill net receipts, pollock and hake being sent to split, totaled a round 50,000 pounds.

BOSTON HAS 18 VESSELS AT PIER

RECEIPTS THIS MORNING ARE MOSTLY GROUND FISH—FOUR SEINERS HAVE MACKEREL.

A firmer market with higher prices prevailed at the Boston fish pier this morning. There were 18 arrivals on hand with 650,000 pounds of groundfish, 31,000 pounds of fresh mackerel and 125,000 pounds of mixed fish.

The market was strong and prices on about all varieties were higher. Haddock opened at \$3; large cod, \$4; markets, \$2 and mackerel, 5.50 to 5.60 cents per pound.
