

# DRAGGERS LAND FEW REDFISH

LEONORA C. AT GORTON-PEW'S WITH 30,000—NETTERS HAD 9500 POLLOCK.

Only 39,500 pounds of fresh fish was landed here in the past 24 hours. A dragger had 30,000 redfish at Gorton-Pew Cold Storage for filleting and six gill netters had 9500 pollock; Murray & Tarr took two netters with 4000 pollock; Producers Fish company, one with 2500; Capt. Gerry Shoares, two with 2000, and the Cape Ann Cold Storage, one with 1000 pounds pollock.

**Receipts Larger**  
Fisheries Commissioner, Frank T. Bell said yesterday landings by fishing vessels at the three principal New England ports, Boston, Gloucester and Portland, amounted to 231,691,834 pounds during the first seven months of 1936, compared with 220,151,613 pounds during the corresponding period last year.

July, 1936, landings at Boston totaled 32,227,231 pounds, valued at \$838,795, compared with 29,923,582 pounds, valued at \$673,591, in July last year.

Gloucester landings amounted to 4,964,018 pounds, valued at \$96,606, compared with 6,722,908 and a value of \$94,270 for July, 1935.

Portland landings totaled 1,162,352 pounds, valued at \$29,007, compared with 1,235,925 pounds, valued at \$32,144 for July last year.

**Portland News**  
Six fishing vessels landed a total of 94,000 pounds of groundfish at local wholesalers Wednesday, the largest total fare in several weeks. The schooner Verma G. had 26,000 pounds; sch. Eleanor, 25,000 pounds; and the gill netters Onward III, 23,000; Pofisco, 10,000 and the Elizabeth B. and Hortense had 5000 pounds each.

# RECEIPTS WERE FAIRLY HEAVY

BOSTON HAD 22 ARRIVALS THIS MORNING, INCLUDING SEVEN SEINERS.

Twenty-two arrivals brought to the Boston fish pier this morning 403,000 pounds of groundfish, 150,000 pounds of fresh mackerel, 405,000 pounds of redfish, 302,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market was fairly good on all varieties. Mackerel brought 3 1-4 to 3.35 cents per pound and 3 cents for "blinks." A total of 67 swordfish arrived by steamer yesterday from the Provinces.

Twenty-eight boats were on hand for the half day session at the Boston fish pier this morning. Eleven were seiners with 208,000 pounds. Other receipts were 52 swordfish, 140,000 pounds of redfish, 1200 pounds of butterfish and 100,000 pounds of mixed fish. Sch. Josephine and Margaret came in with the swordfish and held over until Monday's market. Mackerel held up fairly well and groundfish prices were firm with a light supply.

# MANY MACKEREL OVER WEEK-END FORTY-ONE IN BOSTON FLEET

SIX SEINERS LANDED 300,000 POUNDS HERE—THREE REDFISH FARES.

The past week-end saw a lively local waterfront when a total of 714,600 pounds of fresh fish was landed at local wharves with a beam trawler having 155,000 pounds of fresh groundfish at the Gorton-Pew Cold Storage wharf, mostly for filleting; six seiners having 298,300 pounds of mackerel; three draggers, 180,000 redfish; eight gill netters, 45,700 pounds of pollock; two draggers, 30,000 dressed whiting; and a small seiner, 5600 pounds bluebacks.

Besides the beam trawler, Gorton-Pew Cold storage had a dragger with 15,000 whiting, while the Cape Ann Cold Storage had two draggers with 130,000 redfish for filleting, and a dragger with 15,000 whiting; Producers Fish company, a seiner with 62,000 mackerel and a trap with 1000 mackerel; Slade-Gorton branch of Gorton-Pew a dragger with 50,000 redfish for filleting, a seiner with 40,000 mackerel, and a small seiner with 5600 bluebacks; Frank E. Davis Fish company, two seiners with 98,000 mackerel; Pew wharf of Gorton-Pew, a seiner with 57,300 mackerel; and Davis Brothers wharf, a seiner with 40,000 mackerel.

# ELMER GRAY HAS FORTY-TWO IN SALT FISH CARGO BOSTON FLEET

THIRTEEN SEINERS AND THREE SWORDERS AMONG DAY'S ARRIVALS—MARKET FAIR.

At the Boston fish pier this morning, there were 42 new arrivals, including 13 with mackerel and three swordfish. Total receipts were 661,000 pounds of groundfish, 164 swordfish, 700 pounds of butterfish, 393,000 pounds of mackerel, 611,000 pounds of mixed fish.

# SEPTEMBER 12, 1936. GASPE SALT TRIP AT PEW'S TODAY

M. V. APOHAQUI IN WITH 350,000—TODAY'S RECEIPTS TOTAL 100,000 FRESH FISH.

One salt fish cargo and 100,000 pounds of fresh fish compose arrivals in this port since yesterday, when the motor vessel Apohaqui from Grand river, Gaspe, docked at the Pew wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries yesterday afternoon with 350,000 pounds of salt cod. The Cape Ann Cold Storage had a dragger with 30,000 redfish and a dragger with 25,000 dressed whiting, while the Gorton branch of Gorton-Pew Fisheries had a small seiner with 11,000 bluebacks and a fleet of nine gill netters lifted 34,000 pounds of pollock. Murray & Tarr, two netters, 6500; Producers Fish company, one netter, 2000; and Cape Ann Cold Storage, one netter, 1500.
