

STR. FORDHAM AT G.-P. STORAGE

HAS 150,000 GROUND FISH TO FILLET—ONE MACKEREL TRIP HERE TODAY.

A beam trawler landed 150,000 pounds of cod, haddock and other fresh fish at the Gorton-Pew Cold Storage wharf. There was a dragger there with 5000 dressed whiting.

At the Gorton branch is a dragger with 75,000 redfish for filleting, while Murray & Tarr has 3000 large mackerel from the seiner Mary F. Curtis, Capt. Ambrose Fleet. The Cape Ann Cold Storage has a dragger with 5000 redfish to fillet, and the Producers Fish company has a dragger with 3000 flounders.

The gill net fleet of 15 boats had 58,000 pollock, taken out as follows: Capt. Gerry Shoares, four netters, 23,000 pounds; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, three, 12,500; Murray & Tarr, two, 11,000; Portland Fish company, three, 3500; Producers Fish company, one, 3000; Cape Ann Cold Storage company, one, 3000; Percy Parkhurst, one, 2000.

Receipts at the Boston fish pier for the week ending October 1, topped the 7,000,000 pounds and were over 2,000,000 pounds ahead of the same week of 1935. Last week 162 arrivals brought 7,634,600 pounds of fresh fish to the pier. In the same week a year ago, 102 arrivals brought in 5,217,700 pounds of fresh fish.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1936—2,043,300 pounds of haddock; 1,342,000 pounds of scrod; 432,500 pounds of large cod; 759,700 pounds of market cod; 3,054,100 pounds of mixed fish.

1935—1,464,300 pounds of haddock; 1,191,000 pounds of scrod; 345,000 pounds of large cod; 511,400 pounds of market cod; 1,703,100 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there have been 5155 arrivals and receipts of 238,308,714 pounds of fresh fish. In the same period of 1935, there were 4937 arrivals with 217,325,900 pounds of fresh fish.

THIRTY-ONE AT THE BOSTON PIER

RECEIPTS OVER 1,500,000 POUNDS THIS MORNING—MARKET CONTINUOUS STRONG

A fleet of 31 vessels arrived at the Boston fish pier this morning with 660,000 pounds of groundfish, 440,000 pounds of redfish, 535,000 pounds of mixed fish and a small lot of 4500 pounds of fresh mackerel. The mackerel brought a fancy price, 12 1-2 cents per pound. Other prices held up. Haddock sold at \$4 to \$5; large cod, \$5 to \$5.25, and markets, \$3 on the opening.

FEW MACKEREL

A few netters are operating and have landed a few fish during the last week.

According to official figures just received the amount of mackerel in cold storages of the United States on September 15, 1936, was 7,340,807 pounds as compared with 10,578,508 pounds on September 15, 1935.

The amount of frozen fish for the month ending September 15, 1936 was 660,013 pounds as compared with 1,629,361 pounds frozen during August 15—September 15, 1935.

In the corresponding week a year ago the mackerel fleet landed 610,000 pounds of fresh mackerel caught mostly off No Man's land. They were mostly one-pound fish.

SALT MACKEREL FOR GORTON-PEW

THIRTEEN SMALL FARES TOTAL 107,000 POUNDS AT HUB—RED-FISH RECEIPTS HEAVY.

Nearly 2,000,000 pounds of fresh fish were brought to the Boston fish pier this morning by 46 vessels, including 13 seiners with small mackerel fares. Receipts were 692,000 pounds of groundfish, 547,000 pounds of redfish, 107,000 pounds of fresh mackerel and 510,000 pounds of mixed fish. Market was still good on groundfish. Mackerel brought 7 and 8 cents per pound. A shipment of 25,000 pounds of pollock was received yesterday by rail.

BRITISH FREIGHTER LANDS 600 BARRELS FROM MAGDALENS—DRAGGER HAS 75,000 REDS.

Over 300,000 pounds of salt and fresh fish arrived in this port since yesterday when a British motor vessel from Magdalen islands, was at the Pew wharf with 600 barrels of salt bulk mackerel, and 60,000 pounds of salt cod; a dragger was at Gorton's with 75,000 redfish to fillet; two draggers were at Producers' Fish company with 9000 whiting and flounders; and 16 gill netters had 65,200 pollock. FIVE REDFISH FARES IN HERE

GORTON-PEW TAKES 305,000 TO FILLET—GILL NETTERS HAD 25,200 POLLOCK.

Gloucester had more than her share of redfish to fillet today when five draggers arrived here with 380,000 pounds of which two trips with 160,000 pounds went to Gorton branch of Gorton-Pew Fisheries; two trips with 145,000 pounds to the Cold Storage branch of the same firm, and one trip with 75,000 pounds to Cape Ann Cold Storage company. An overland shipment of 4500 pounds of herring was landed at the Pew branch of Gorton-Pew. There were 12 gill netters landing 25,000 pounds of pollock of which three went to Murray & Tarr with 9000 pounds; three to Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department with 7500, three to Portland Fish company, with 4500; one to Cape Ann Cold Storage with 2000; one to Producers Fish company with 2000; and one to Percy C. Parkhurst with 700 pounds.
