# GROUNDFISH IN MODERATE SUPPLY

**LAST WEEK'S LANDINGS NEARLY SIX AND HALF MILLION MARK.**

Haddock and codfish have been in moderate supply from the fishing fleet and sold at good prices. Boats continue to land catches from Georges. For the week ending October 15 there were 128 arrivals at the Boston pier with 6,423,000 pounds of fresh fish as compared with 108 arrivals and receipts of 5,778,000 pounds of fresh fish landed in the corresponding week of 1935.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1936—1,343,700 of haddock, 867,500 pounds of scrod; 419,600 pounds of large cod; 806,800 pounds of market cod; 2,985,400 pounds of mixed fish. 1935—1,480,600 pounds of haddock, 720,000 pounds of scrod; 541,200 pounds of large cod; 914,100 pounds of market cod; 2,132,900 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there were 5438 arrivals with 251,661,814 pounds of fresh fish while in the same period of 1935 there were 5173 arrivals with 227,681,900 pounds of fresh fish.

# FEW MACKEREL LANDED LAST WEEK

TOTAL RECEIPTS 672,100 POUNDS —SEASON'S CATCH LESS.

A few small trips of mackerel were landed during the past week. A fleet of 25 have been operating on Georges but report fish as a rule in small schools with schools of blackfish numerous and a menace to seining. The water does not fire as much as usual at this season of the year which makes it difficult to locate the schools. Total receipts of mackerel last week were 672,100 pounds.

In the corresponding week last year the mackerel fleet landed less than 100,000 pounds, caught off No Man's Land and some off Provincetown.

The total catch of mackerel has been 34,496,450 pounds as compared with 40,673,400 pounds in the same period of 1935 and 34,357,704 pounds in 1934.
