

# BOSTON MARKET IS LOWER TODAY

RECEIPTS OF ALL KINDS ARE ABOUT NORMAL FROM 22 BOATS.

Twenty-two boats were on the arrival list at the Boston fish pier this morning. They brought in 440,000 pounds of groundfish, 465,000 pounds of redfish and 395,000 pounds of mixed fish, a total of 1,300,000 pounds another boost towards a new all-time record for receipts for the year at the Hub.

Prices slid off some this morning. Haddock was down to \$3 to \$3.25; large cod, \$2.50 and markets, \$2.75. Yesterday a carload of frozen smelt was received overland from Canada.

# ANOTHER BIG WEEK AT PIER

RECEIPTS 4,449,600 POUNDS FROM 115 FARES WERE LANDED.

Receipts at the Boston fish pier last week again eclipsed the landings for the corresponding week of 1935. There were 115 arrivals for the week ending December 24 with 4,449,600 pounds of fresh fish while in the same week of 1933 there were 133 arrivals with 3,890,800 pounds.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1936—877,100 pounds of haddock; 558,000 pounds of scrod; 418,800 pounds of large cod; 309,100 pounds of market cod; 2,286,800 pounds of mixed fish.

1935—1,005,800 pounds of haddock; 884,000 of scrod; 365,300 pounds of large cod; 273,400 pounds of market cod; 1,362,300 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there have been 6662 arrivals with 309,395,714 pounds of fresh fish. In the same period of 1935, there were 65430 arrivals with 274,748,600 pounds of fresh fish.

# BREEZE CHECKED POLLOCK FARES

FLEET 16 GILL NETTERS HAULED BUT PORTION OF NETS LANDING 60,000 POUNDS.

A stiff breeze offshore prevented the gill netting fleet from lifting all their gear yesterday with the result that the 16 boats had only 60,100 pounds of pollock. There were no other arrivals.

## SMALL FLEET ON HAND AT BOSTON

## BOSTON PER SEES BRIGHT LOOKOUT FOR '37

A number of new records were set at the Boston fish pier during 1936 and the outlook is brighter for 1937. A number of new and modern large trawlers have been launched recently and about 15 more are being constructed or proposed. Last week there were 74 arrivals with 4,141,700 pounds of fresh fish, almost twice as much as in the corresponding week of 1936, when there were 65 arrivals with 2,282,900 pounds of fresh fish.

Receipts were divided as follows:

1936—1,059,500 pounds of haddock; 420,100 pounds of scrod; 235,500 pounds of large cod; 347,000 pounds of market cod; 2,079,600 pounds of mixed fish.

1936 in comparison with 46,289,000 pounds in 1935. These figures include the mackerel landed at all ports but mostly at Boston. The number of trips brought to the Boston pier was 865 as compared with 968 in 1935.

The swordfish fleet numbered 45 as compared with 47 in 1935 and landed 140 trips as compared with 166 in 1935. Total receipts were 18,937, comprising 6472 direct from the fleet, 5318 from Nova Scotia and 7147 from Japan. The total in 1935 amounted to 23,239 fish divided as follows: 12,137 direct from the fleet; 8065 from Nova Scotia and 3037 from Japan.

The growing menace from imported Japanese swordfish is apparent. Receipts from Japan more than doubled in 1936 and the importations were actually more than the number of fish caught by the home fleet.

LANDS 9000 POUNDS AT G.-P. FRESH FISH—ONLY FOUR GILL NETTERS YESTERDAY.
