

# ONE AT BOSTON WITH HALIBUT

EMPERATOR HAS 10,000 POUNDS—OTHER RECEIPTS NEARLY 1,000,000 POUNDS.

Thirteen arrivals were on the list this morning at the Boston fish pier, eight steamers, one halibuter, one haddock from offshore and three small druggers. Sch. Emperor, Capt. ### Portland Fish News

The possibility of developing a shrimp canning industry has so attracted officials of the Burnham & Morrill Company, Portland, that they have purchased 4600 pounds of Gulf of Maine shrimps the past week from Capt. Gaspi Contrino of the Boston dragger Sebastiano and Figli, pioneer shrimp fisherman, for laboratory purposes only.

Captain Contrino's success has attracted the attention of other fishermen from Southwest Harbor and New Harbor in Maine to Boston and Gloucester to such an extent that a steady stream of inquires have been coming in to the Fishermen's Relief Corporation's headquarters at 130-Commercial street regarding the design of the net left by Dr. Johann Hjort and Capt. H. Molum, the Norwegian shrimp experts.

Morrill Allen, vice president of the Burnham & Morrill Company, said Friday that if laboratory tests prove successful and fishermen obtain the proper equipment for fishing, there is an excellent chance of developing the industry as a separate branch of the fisheries.

## PIER RECEIPTS DOWN LAST WEEK

NEARLY 3,000,000 LESS THAN YEAR AGO—TOTAL TO DATE, HOWEVER, HIGHER.

Receipts at the Boston fish pier last week were almost 3,000,000 pounds behind the corresponding week of 1936.

For the week ending March 11 there were 117 arrivals with 5,131,500 pounds of fresh fish while in the corresponding week last year 154 arrivals brought in 7,953,000 pounds of fresh fish. Groundfish have been in fair demand.

Receipts were divided as follows:  
1937—2,985,500 pounds of haddock; 443,000 pounds of scrod; 863,000 pounds of large cod; 563,000 pounds of market cod; 977,000 pounds of mixed fish.

1936—3,931,000 pounds of haddock; 535,000 pounds of scrod; 1,229,700 pounds of large cod; 695,700 pounds of market cod; 1,530,600 pounds of mixed fish.

### Ahead of 1936

From January 1 to date there have been 1095 arrivals with 56,393,000 of fresh fish landed. In the same period of 1936, there were 1199 arrivals and receipts of 50,091,414 pounds of fresh fish.

Groundfish have been in fair demand and the price of haddock ranged from 2 1-2 to 6 cents per pound. In the corresponding week last year the price ranged from 3 to 6 1-2 cents per pound.
