

## HEAVY LANDINGS IN PORT TODAY

BEAM TRAWLER, THREE RED-FISH DRAGGERS SWELL TOTALS TO 393,000 POUNDS.

At this port since yesterday a beam trawler landed 145,000 pounds of cod, haddock and other groundfish at the Gorton-Pew Cold Storage; three draggers had 190,000 pounds of redfish, two trips being at the Cape Ann Cold Storage with 100,000 and one trip at the Slade-Gorton wharf with 90,000; an overland trip of 35,000 pounds of large cod from Boston at the Pew wharf; 7000 pounds of mackerel, of which a seiner at Producers Fish company had 3000 and a trap had 4000 at Tarr's Fish company. At the latter place a group of six small trawlers had 3000 cod, and 6000 whiting were landed at the Cape Ann Cold Storage in three trap boats.

The gill netters, seven of them, had 6900 pounds of cod, divided as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, one boat, 2000 pounds; Capt. John Chianciola, one, 1500; Progressive Fish company, two, 1400; Tarr Fish company, one, 1000; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish company, one, 500; Producers Fish, one, 500.

## FIRST SWORDFISH IS HERE TODAY

SHIPPED TO BOSTON FOR MARKET—DRAGGER LANDS RED-FISH AT GORTON WHARF.

The local schooner Marie and Katherine, Capt. Harry R. Clattenberg, arrived at the Producers Fish wharf early this morning with eight swordfish weighing 1400 pounds, having been forced to return to port when a sea smashed his plank bowsprit. The fish were immediately shipped to the Boston fish pier to be auctioned off there.

Other arrivals totaled 28,700 pounds of fresh fish including a dragger with 10,000 redfish landed at Slade-Gorton branch Gorton Pew Fisheries; three traps with 4000 whiting, a seiner with 8000 mackerel, and a small trawler with 800 cod, all at the Cape Ann Cold Storage, which also had a gill netter with 1000 cod.

The gill netters, seven of them, had a total of 5900 pounds of cod, landed as follows: Capt. John Chianciola, one, 1500; Progressive Fish company, two, 1500; Tarr Fish company, one, 1000; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, one, 600; Producers Fish company, one, 300.

## ONLY THREE AT THE FISH PIER

A meagre supply of fresh fish was offered dealers on the Boston fish pier this morning. There were only three arrivals for the half-day session and receipts were 13,200 pounds of mixed fish and 21,000 pounds of fresh mackerel. Prices were all higher.

More halibut and salmon from the West coast are coming to Boston next week. Shipments aggregating 58,000 pounds of salmon and 82,000 pounds of halibut are due to arrive at the Hub on Monday and Tuesday.

## MORE REDFISH OVER WEEK-END

THREE DRAGGERS HAD 230,000 POUNDS—OTHER BOATS LAND 42,000 POUNDS

Some 272,300 pounds of fresh fish was landed here over the week-end when three draggers had 230,000 redfish, 11 traps, 16,000 whiting and 3000 mackerel, 16 small boats, 6000 cod and 4000 pollock, a small dragger, 3000 flounders, six gill netters, 9100 cod, and a small netter, 1200 mackerel.

Gorton-Pew Fisheries took two redfish trips, one of 90,000 to Slade-Gorton's, and the other with 60,000 to the Cold Storage, while the Cape Ann Cold Storage had a dragger with 80,000, besides three traps with 6000 whiting, three "drailers" with 4000 pollock, and a gill netter with 1600 cod.

Tarr Fish company had 12 small boats with 6000 cod, six traps, 3000 mackerel, and two gill netters, 3200 cod; Producers Fish company, a netter, 1200 mackerel, trap boat, 8000 whiting, dragger, 3000 flounders; Pew wharf, trap boat, 2000 whiting; Capt. John Chianciola, a gill netter, 2400 cod; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, a gill netter, 1200 cod; and Progressive Fish company, a gill netter, 700 cod.

## FIFTY-SIX BOATS IN BOSTON FLEET

RECEIPTS OVER 2,500,000 POUNDS—TWO HALIBUTERS AND SWORDER ON HAND.

The Boston fish pier was crowded this morning with every available bit of docking space occupied by a fleet of 56 vessels, including a couple of halibuters, a sworder and four with mackerel. It was the largest arrival list for sometime and the receipts approached the record for a single day's landings.

Total was 1,420,000 pounds of groundfish, 200,000 pounds of redfish, 70,000 pounds of halibut, 23 swordfish, 129,000 pounds of fresh mackerel, 2500 pounds of salt mackerel and 690,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market was fair at the opening.

## BEAM TRAWLER AT COLD STORAGE

STR. NOTRE DAME HAS 133,000 POUNDS—FOUR DRAGGERS LAND 335,000 REDFISH.

Gloucester had a good day for arrivals when 509,400 pounds was landed besides 10,000 pounds of salt cod, brought here with 5000 pounds of cusk for Davis Brothers in the halibuter, American.

A beam trawler had 133,000 pounds of fresh fish for the Gorton-Pew cold storage, four draggers had 335,000 redfish, three of which has 275,000 for Slade-Gorton branch of Gorton-Pew, while the other with 60,000 pounds went to the Cape Ann cold storage where also was landed 8000 whiting from the traps.

Three seiners—a trap and a netter had 7200 mackerel. A seiner landed 3500 mackerel at the Progressive Fish company. The others were at the Producers Fish company. The Pew branch had an overland trip of 15,000 large cod from Boston.

The gill netters, seven of them, had 6200 cod, of which the Progressive Fish company had two with 2100 pounds; Cape Ann Cold Storage, one, 1000; Tarr Fish company, one, 1000; Capt. John Chianciola, one, 1000; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, one, 600; Producers Fish company, one, 500.

## SMALLER FLEET HIGHER PRICES

HADDOCK UP TO \$4 AND MACKEREL 5 1-2 CENTS AT BOSTON PIER TODAY.

A fleet of 19 vessels was on hand at the Boston fish pier this morning. With the exception of three with mackerel they brought in ground and flat fish. Total receipts were 580,000 pounds of groundfish, 44,000 pounds of fresh mackerel and 240,400 pounds of mixed fish.

The market was stronger this morning on all varieties except market cod. Haddock brought \$4; large cod, \$4 and mackerel 5 1-2 cents per pound. Market cod were down to \$1.50 to \$1.75.

## BOSTON LANDINGS AGAIN UNDER

PIER FLEET BROUGHT 6,686,500 POUNDS, HOWEVER, FOR THE WEEK.

Receipts at the Boston fish pier last week were again under the corresponding week of 1936. There were 137 arrivals during the week ending June 10, with 6,686,500 pounds of fresh fish. In the same week a year ago, there were 137 arrivals but the receipts were 7,989,900 pounds of fresh fish.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1937—1,789,500 pounds of haddock; 775,000 pounds of scrod; 678,200 pounds of large cod, 1,487,000 pounds of market cod; 1,986,100 pounds mixed fish. 1936—1,582,400 pounds of haddock; 1,267,500 pounds of scrod; 502,100 pounds of large cod; 776,500 pounds of market cod; 2,856,400 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there have been 2744 arrivals with 138,495,400 pounds of fresh fish. In the same period of 1936, there were 2903 arrivals with 140,579,714 pounds of fresh fish.
