

## ANOTHER HEAVY SUPPLY AT HUB

**TWENTY-THREE ARRIVALS HAD 1,300,000 POUNDS THIS MORNING.**

Twenty-three vessels, most of them from off shore, were on hand at the Boston fish pier when the opening bell sounded for the resumption of trading. They brought in 689,000 pounds of groundfish, 299,000 pounds of redfish and 431,000 pounds of mixed fish. Most varieties were still in brisk demand.

Haddock sold at \$5 to \$6.50, large cod, \$3.50 and markets, \$3. A few mackerel arrived overland sold for 12 cents per pound. The Jean Francis was on hand from Nova Scotia ports with 142 boxes of mixed groundfish.

## LARGE SUPPLY FRESH FISH HERE

**OVER 374,000 POUNDS ARRIVED TODAY—GILL NETTERS HAD 191,000 POLLOCK.**

Three druggers, 27 gill netters and two mackerel netters accounted for 374,000 pounds of fresh fish here since yesterday when a dragger had 85,000 pounds of redfish at the Slade Gorton wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries, another had 60,000 redfish at the Gorton-Pew cold storage, and the third 30,000 pollock and cod at the Producers Fish company. A mackerel netter with 6000 pounds took out at the Progressive Fish company, and the other with 2000 mackerel at the Cape Ann Cold Storage wharf.

The gill netters with a total of 191,000 pollock, landed as follows: Hart Gerry Shoares, three boats, 40,000 pounds; Cape Ann Cold Storage company, six, 36,500; Murray & Tarr, five, 32,500; Capt. ## TWENTY-FOUR IN BOSTON'S FLEET

**RECEIPTS TOTAL MILLION AND A QUARTER POUNDS WITH NO REDFISH.**

When the bell rang for the opening at the Boston fish pier this morning 24 vessels were in the dock, half of them from offshore grounds. Total receipts were 800,000 pounds of groundfish and 446,400 pounds of mixed fish. For the first time in a long while there were no redfish in the market. Prices continued fairly strong with haddock leading at \$5 to \$6. Large cod sold for \$3 and markets, \$2.50 to \$3.

## ONE NETTER HAS MACKEREL FARE

**LANDED 2600 AT PROGRESSIVE WHARF—GILL NETTERS ADD 234,000 POLLOCK.**

Some 240,000 pounds of fresh fish have been landed in this port since yesterday when 26 gill netters had 233,300 pounds of pollock, two small trawlers 4000 pounds of cod and hake at the Cape Ann Cold Storage wharf, and a mackerel netter had 2600 pounds at the Progressive Fish company.

## SMALL FLEET AT BOSTON TODAY

**SEVENTEEN ARRIVALS HAVE ABOUT 775,000 POUNDS—MARKET UNCHANGED.**

Only a small fleet of 10 was on hand this morning at the Boston fish pier. One fare of 15,000 pounds of fresh mackerel which brought nine cents per pound was landed by the Santa Maria. Other receipts totaled 108,000 pounds of groundfish, 360,000 pounds of redfish and 206,000 pounds of mixed fish.
