

HEAVY POLLOCK FARES LANDED

FLEET OF 13 GILL NETTERS HAD 61,300 POUNDS—THREE SEINERS HAD MACKEREL.

Close to 100,000 pounds of fresh fish has been landed in this port since yesterday when 13 gill netters had 98,300 pounds of pollock and cod; three seiners and a trap, 26,000 mackerel, mostly small; two traps, 7000 whiting; and a small seiner, 4000 bluebacks.

The Producers' Fish company had two seiners with 8000 mackerel, and a gill netter, 4500 pollock; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, a seiner, 8000 mackerel, and two gill netters, 10,000 pollock; Tarr Fish company, a trap with 3000 whiting and 10,000 mackerel, and two gill netters, 9500 pollock; Cape Ann Cold Storage, a trap, 4000 whiting, and four gill netters, 19,000 pollock; Slade-Gorton branch, a small seiner, 4000 bluebacks; Progressive Fish company, three gill netters, 12,300 pollock; Capt. MUCH REDFISH LANDED HERE

THREE DRAGGERS HAD 205,000 POUNDS—GILL NETTERS 54,000 POUNDS POLLOCK.

Landings of fresh fish at this port since yesterday included a total of 290,000 pounds in which three draggers had 205,000 redfish, 13 gill netters, 54,000 pollock; a dragger 12,700 groundfish; traps, 2400 butterfish, 3000 whiting, 500 squid, 850 "spike" mackerel, the traps taking out at Cape Ann Cold Storage; five seiners, 7400 mackerel; small trawlers at Tarr Fish company, 4000 pollock.

Slade-Gorton branch had a dragger with 85,000 redfish; Cape Ann Cold Storage, one with 60,000 redfish, and Gorton-Pew Cold Storage, one, 60,000 redfish. The gill net fleet went as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, four boats, 19,000 pounds; Progressive Fish company, three, 10,000; Gorton-Pew Fish department, two, 9000; Tarr Fish company, two, 6000; Capt. John Chianciola, one, 6000; Producers Fish company one, 4000.

TRAWLER AT COLD STORAGE

LANDS 175,000 POUNDS THERE TODAY—WEEK-END RECEIPTS OVER 442,000 POUNDS.

Week-end receipts of fresh fish in this port reached a total of 442,300 pounds besides two swordfish.

A beam trawler had 175,000 pounds of cod, haddock and mixed fish at the Gorton-Pew Cold Storage; two draggers, 140,000 redfish, one trip at the Slade-Gorton's branch, with 80,000, and the other at the Cape Ann Cold Storage, with 60,000 and two swordfish. Three seiners and two traps had 12,800 pounds of mackerel at the Producers Fish company, while a seiner had 2400 mackerel at the Progressive Fish company, and a trap 3000 whiting at the Cape Ann Cold Storage.

The fleet of 14 gill netters accounted for 109,100 pounds of pollock and cod, mostly pollock, over the week-end in two lifts, landing them as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, five boats, 37,000 pounds; Progressive Fish company, three, 20,600; Gorton-Pew fresh fish department, two, 17,000; Tarr Fish company, two, 15,000; Producers Fish company, one, 11,500; Capt. MACKEREL CATCH STILL FAR BELOW

RECEIPTS TO DATE LESS THAN THIRD FOR SAME PERIOD OF LAST YEAR.

The mackerel fleet continues to meet with little success. Last week the boats landed about 300,000 pounds of fresh mackerel and quite a proportion were "blinks" or "tacks" that weighed under a half pound. They were caught mostly in Barnstable Bay close in shore and seining is difficult without danger of tearing the gear.

In the corresponding week last year, the fleet had poor success, landing only a total of 419,500 pounds. The mackerel were caught off South Shoal light and comprised medium and small fish. The prices ranged from 3.6 to 7.75 cents per pound.

Total catch of mackerel to date has been 7,220,200 pounds of mackerel. In 1936, it was 23,521,100 pounds; 1935, 23,882,700 pounds; 1934, 15,210,600 pounds; 1933, 14,161,160 pounds.
