

## LARGE FLEET OF NETTERS ARRIVE

**TWENTY BOATS LANDED 52,800 POUNDS POLLOCK—ONE RED-FISH FARE AT PRODUCERS.**

A fleet of 20 gill netters, a dragger and a seiner accounted for 108,700 pounds of fresh fish here. The seiner landed 900 pounds of mackerel at the Progressive Fish company, the dragger, 55,000 pounds of redfish at Producers Fish company, and 20 gill netters 52,800 pounds of pollock.

The netters landed as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, seven boats, 21,700 pounds; Capt. John Chianciola, three, 9000; Progressive Fish company, five, 8100; Tarr Fish company, one, 6000; Producers Fish company, two, 5000; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, two, 3000.

### Redfish Receipts

Receipts of redfish at Boston fish pier last week amounted to 1,276,500 pounds as compared with 2,176,000 pounds in the corresponding week last year. The price paid last week was 1 1-2 cents to 1.75 cents per pound. In the corresponding week of 1936, it was 1.25 to 2 cents per pound.

## FEW SWORDERS STILL IN GAME

Receipts of swordfish continue light at Boston. Only four or five more vessels are still out and boats are giving up this kind of fishing as they arrive. Total receipts to date have 9994 fish, 4834 from the fleet and 5160 from Nova Scotia. Prices ranged last week from 25 to 27 for large and 18 to 20 cents for 'pups.'

Receipts of swordfish to the corresponding date last year amounted to 11,636 swordfish, 5984 from the fleet and 5652 from Nova Scotia. Prices ranged from 20 to 26 cents for large and 17 to 24 cents per pound for 'pups.'

## HEAVY SUPPLY AT FISH PIER

**RECEIPTS TOTAL NEARLY 1,500,000 POUNDS AGAIN TODAY—NO MACKEREL OR SWORDS.**

Twenty-six vessels were at the Boston Fish pier when the bell rang for trading to open this morning. They all had groundfish and mixed fish and no mackerel or swordfish. Total receipts were 767,000 pounds of groundfish and 711,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market was fair at the outset with haddock bringing \$3.25; large cod, \$4, and markets, \$3.

## PIER LANDINGS AGAIN FELL OFF

**LAST WEEK'S RECEIPTS MILLION LESS THAN SAME WEEK YEAR AGO**

Receipts of fresh fish at the Boston pier last week were about a million pounds behind the same week of 1936. For the week ending September 16, there were 123 arrivals with 5,733,100 pounds of fresh fish as compared with 133 arrivals and receipts of 6,567,100 pounds in the corresponding week of 1936.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1937—1,515,000 pounds of haddock; 1,010,200 pounds of scrod; 256,500 pounds of large cod; 811,700 pounds of market cod; 2,160,700 pounds of mixed fish.

1936—1,542,300 pounds of haddock; 917,500 pounds of scrod; 323,200 pounds of large cod; 534,300 pounds of market cod; 3,255,800 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there have been 4545 arrivals with 222,095,400 pounds of fresh fish as compared with 4863 arrivals and receipts of 225,156,414 pounds of fresh fish in the corresponding period of 1936.

## LIGHT RECEIPTS OF MACKEREL

**Last Week's Total Only 341,300 Lbs. Mostly Blink Variety.**

Receipts of mackerel continue light. Total landings the past week were 341,300 pounds and comprised mostly "blinks" that weighed two or three to a pound, and the larger fish from one pound up. They were caught mostly in the vicinity of Cape Cod. Price ranged from 9 to 11 cents per pound for large and 4 1-2 to 7 cents for the blinks.

In the corresponding week last year the fleet landed 1,884,200 pounds of fresh mackerel, mostly small and medium fish that were caught off No Man's Land. Prices ranged from 2.6 to 4.1 cents per pound for large and 2 to 3.25 cents per pound for blinks.

The catch of mackerel to date has been 8,238,700 pounds as compared with 32,595,550 pounds in 1936; 38,067,000 pounds in 1935; 29,841,140 pounds in 1934 and 21,657,660 pounds in 1933.

**NUMBERED 21 BOATS YESTERDAY WITH 59,400 POLLOCK—REDFISH DRAGGER ARRIVED.**

One dragger and 21 gill netters landed 104,400 pounds of fresh fish yesterday. The dragger had 45,000 pounds of redfish at the Slade-Gorton wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries, while the gill netters had 59,400 pounds of pollock. ## BOSTON RECEIPTS ARE FAIRLY HEAVY

**TWENTY-TWO ARRIVALS HAVE OVER 1,100,000 POUNDS—ONE HALIBUTER IN.**

Sch. Dawn, Capt. Archie MacLeod, back from halibuting, was among the 22 arrivals at the Boston fish pier this morning. Capt. MacLeod hauled for 25,000 pounds of halibut, 20,000 salt cod; a swordfish and 7000 fresh cod.

**HALF DOZEN SEINERS HAVE SMALL FARES—HALIBUTER THERE, TOO.**

## MACKEREL BOATS LANDED "SPIKES"

FIVE SEINERS HAD 10,500 LBS. HERE TODAY—24 GILL NET BOATS LIFTED.

Five seiners, 24 gill netters, a small dragger, a halibuter, and an overland trip accounted for 121,600 pounds of fresh and salt fish in this port since yesterday when the halibuter from Boston landed 20,000 pounds of salt cod, and 7000 pounds of hake at the Pew wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries where also went the overland trip of 20,000 pounds of cusk. The seiners had 10,500 pounds of mackerel, mostly "spikes," landing them as follows: Producers Fish company, two seiners, 4000 pounds; Cape Ann Cold Storage, one, 3000; Tarr Fish company, one, 2000; and Progressive Fish company, one, 1500. ## THREE DRAGGERS LANDED REDFISH

ARRIVED HERE WITH 160,000 POUNDS—FREIGHTER HAS 450,000 SALT COD.

Some 688,000 pounds of fresh and salt fish were landed here since yesterday. A British freighter had 450,000 pounds of salt cod at the Slade-Gorton wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries, and a halibuter from Boston had 8000 salt cod at the Pew wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries.
