

GILL NETS HAD BIG FARES HERE

FLEET OF 23 BOATS LANDED
90,500 POUNDS POLLOCK—TWO
DRAGGERS ARRIVED.

A fleet of 23 gill netters and two draggers had 103,500 pounds of pollock, whiting and flounders yesterday. A dragger landed 11,000 whiting at the Slade-Gorton wharf of the Gorton-Pew Fisheries, and the other dragger had 2000 flounders at the Producers' Fish company.

The gill netters landed 90,500 pounds of pollock, as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, eight boats, 23,500 pounds; Progressive Fish company, five, 19,500; Tarr Fish company, three, 16,000; Capt. John Chianciola, three, 12,000; Producers' Fish company, three, 12,000; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, two, 7,500.

A fleet of 49 boats, mostly from shore fishing, was on hand this morning at the Boston fish pier. They brought in 877,000 pounds of groundfish, 182,000 pounds of redfish and 804,000 pounds of mixed fish. The market opened up well with all varieties in good demand. Haddock sold for \$5 to \$5.50; large cod, \$4 to \$5.25, and markets, \$3.25 to \$3.50. Redfish brought \$2.20 per 100 pounds.

A fleet of 26 gill netters, a Boston dragger accounted for 250,000 pounds of fresh fish in this port. A dragger was due this forenoon with 150,000 redfish and 6000 mixed fish for the Slade-Gorton wharf of Gorton-Pew Fisheries. A British motor vessel had 215,000 pounds of salt cod yesterday of which 100,000 pounds were taken by Charles F. Matlage & Sons, 100,000 by Davis Brothers, and 15,000 by Frank E. Davis company.
