

LAST WEEK'S PIER LANDINGS FELL

FLEET HAS 5,378,100 POUNDS FROM 101 ARRIVALS—YEAR'S TOTAL ALSO LESS.

Receipts of fresh fish at the Boston fish pier for the week ending October 14 were 5,378,100 pounds from 101 arrivals. This was over a million pounds under the corresponding week of 1936 when 128 arrivals brought in 6,423,000 pounds.

Receipts were divided as follows: 1937—1,141,500 pounds of haddock; 769,500 pounds of scrod; 475,700 pounds of large cod; 897,400 pounds of market cod; 2,147,000 pounds of mixed fish.

1936—1,343,700 pounds of haddock; 867,500 pounds of scrod; 419,600 pounds of large cod; 806,800 pounds of market cod; 2,984,400 pounds of mixed fish.

From January 1 to date there have been 5118 arrivals at Boston with 247,952,800 pounds of fresh fish while in the corresponding period of 1936, there were 5436 arrivals with 251,661,814 pounds of fresh fish brought in.

LIGHT LANDINGS OF MACKEREL

Receipts of mackerel last week were very light and the few landed were caught off Cape Cod where a few seiners are still hovering.

In the corresponding week last year the mackerel fleet landed 672,100 pounds of mackerel caught mostly on Georges bank where small schools were found.

There have been some salt mackerel imported. A boat brought 316 barrels to Gloucester last week and the steamer from Norway had 300 barrels last week for Philadelphia.

The catch of mackerel to date has been 9,190,300 pounds as compared with 34,406,450 pounds in 1936; 40,673,400 pounds in 1935; and 34,357,704 pounds in 1934.

Portland News.

With an 85,000-pound groundfish fare landed at Portland, Monday by the Gloucester schooner Ruth and Margaret, Capt. Mike Clark raised his season total brought to Portland to 227,000 pounds, more than one-third of the total he landed there all last winter. His other fares were 45,000 pounds and 97,000 pounds.

Capt. Clark planned to sail at night or this morning for Gloucester to lay up the Ruth and Margaret for engine repairs and to take over the schooner Raymonde. He said he would take bait and ice at Boothbay Harbor and return to Portland from Cashes Bank about Wednesday with another fare.

Other groundfish fares were landed at Portland, Monday by the Verna G., 20,000 pounds; and the Alice M. Doughty II, 6000 pounds. The Benjamin Thompson and the Eleanor are expected in from the grounds today.

THREE DRAGGERS LANDED REDFISH

HAILED FOR 773,000 POUNDS TODAY—GILL NETTERS HERE WITH 61,400 POUNDS.

A fleet of three druggers and 27 gill netters landed 201,400 pounds of fresh fish here. The druggers had 113,000 pounds of redfish to be filleted, and 27,000 pounds of haddock, cod and mixed fish, while the netters had 61,400 pounds of pollock, haddock and cod. Gorton-Pew Cold Storage had one dragger with 8000 redfish and 17,000 haddock and mixed fish; Slade-Gorton branch had one dragger with 80,000 redfish; and Cape Ann Cold Storage had one with 25,000 redfish and 10,000 haddock.

The netters landed as follows: Cape Ann Cold Storage, nine boats, 16,400 pounds; Tarr Fish company, four, 11,000; Progressive Fish company, five, 10,700; Producers Fish company, three, 10,000; Capt. John Chianciola, three, 7500; Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish department, three, 5800.

RECEIPTS ARE OVER 1,700,000 POUNDS—\$3.50 FOR HADDOCK THIS MORNING.

Thirty-seven boats were on the arrival list this morning at the Boston fish pier and total receipts of 929,000 pounds of groundfish, 105,000 pounds of redfish and 702,000 pounds of mixed fish was ample for the demand. DRAGGERS LAND DRESSED WHITING

FOUR BOATS HAD 33,000 POUNDS AT GORTON-PEW'S—NETTERS HAD 47,100 POUNDS.

Over 109,200 pounds of fresh fish has been landed here since yesterday. A dragger had 17,000 redfish and 8000 mixed fish at the Gorton-Pew Cold Storage wharf, where also were four druggers with 33,100 pounds of dressed whiting, while another dragger had 4000 whiting and hake at the Producers Fish company.

FREIGHTER HAS SALT FISH CARGO

BRINGS 435,000 POUNDS TO GORTON-PEW—DRAGGERS HERE WITH REDFISH

Fresh and salt fish here amounted to 673,000 pounds since yesterday. A British motor vessel had 435,000 salt cod and hake, 26 barrels salt mackerel and 50 barrels of cod oil for Gorton-Pew Fisheries at the Pew wharf; a dragger had 82,000 redfish at Slade-Gorton's, where another dragger had 8000 dressed whiting. Both boats landed 15,500 cod, haddock and hake at Gorton-Pew Fresh Fish wharf.

Gorton-Pew Cold storage had two druggers with 8300 dressed whiting; Cape Ann Cold storage a dragger with 40,000 redfish and 20,000 haddock and cod. A fleet of 26 gill netters accounted for 63,300 pounds of pollock, cod and hake, as follows: Cape Ann Cold storage, eight boats, 14,500 pounds; Tarr Fish company, four, 13,500; Capt.
