Gentlemen;

We beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 13th. We have read same carefully and submit herewith full and complete information supplementing our letter of February 18th.

Our principal pack of herring was put up at Big Port Walter. We also packed a small quantity at Seymour canal, not very far from Big Port Walter plant, and for convenience sake when submitting your requested report, we included the pack at Seymour Canal with that of the pack at Big Port Walter. The quantities we packed, as advised you in our letter of February 18th, are perfectly correct. If you have information to the effect that we packed a larger quantity of Scotch cure herring than we reported to you, such information is wrong and misleading. Whoever furnished you with such information must have confused our firm with that of the Alaska Herring and Sardine Company of this city.

Reiterating the information furnished you in our letter of February 18th, we beg to advise that our total pack of Scotch cure herring amounted to 1585 bbls. of 200 lbs. each, and 1091 bbls. of 125 lbs. each. The remainder of our pack, consisting of 5877 bbls. herring 200 lbs. each and 11 tierces herring, 800 lbs. each, we packed and cured Norway style.
