M. Bloch & Co. is a new fish-salting establishment recently started in Juneau. M. Bloch is a representative of the Lakeside Fish Co., Chicago, New York, Green Bay and Buffalo. He expects shortly to manufacture caviar from herring eggs. (Juneau Empire).

Claus Rodine, of Seattle, is preparing to start a salmon and herring salting plant on Grantley Harbor near Teller, Alaska. (Pacific Fisherman).

The Washington Bay Packing Co., operating at Washington Bay, is engaged in salting herring. (Pacific Fisherman).

H. B. Nelson is organizing a company to engage in the salting of fish at Katchemak Bay. (Pacific Fisherman).

John L. Carlson, former owner of the Taku Canning & Cold Storage Co., Taku Harbor, is building a herring cannery at Auk Bay, which will be ready to operate next season. (Juneau Dispatch).

A new herring-curing plant has been established by Yakamoto & Co., on a large barge at Saginaw Bay. The product will be salted in tanks and boxed for the Chinese markets. (Petersburg Report).
