Memorandum to Mr. Christoffers:

There is inclosed herewith a report of fishery operations in Alaska in 1918 by the Vendsyssel Packing Company, Inc., which is incomplete in that the rig and net tonnage of the registered vessels listed is not given, and the number of launches and other row boats and skiffs is also omitted. It would appear that there is but one of each of the latter boats, yet the report does not so state. It is not for this office to assume anything in respect to these items.

The report further shows that 9 tierces and 419 barrels of coho salmon were packed and that the total number of fish of this species was only 2098. The average is therefore less than 5 fish per barrel. The number of pink salmon seems less than would be required to pack 13 barrels. *OK*

Please see the company in regard to these matters, and get the necessary information to complete the report. Retain possession of the report and return it promptly to this office.

The company's records show that only 552 pink salmon were purchased. They say that often the fishermen would have a one or two pinks & would throw them in without making a charge or they might be counted in as another fish.
