Dear Sir:-

Have been endeavoring to get the information asked for in your letter of the 6th inst and am inclosing a statement of 1920 operations, which I think will give you all the necessary data on expenses etc., but the records turned over to us at the end of the 1920 salmon season, at the time we took over the interests of Paup & MacKenzie, who operated the trap, are very incomplete as regards the different species of salmon sold and price obtained from each.

Some of the salmon was sold to cold storage plants, most of which was sold by the pound, while that sold to canneries was sold by the piece and in making up the report sent in it was necessary to estimate the average weight per fish, but from the information at hand it is impossible to give you an accurate account of fish sold to each without going to the different concerns and getting the information from them and most of their offices are closed here this time of the year. Will endeavor to get you this information, but believe it will be too late for your 1920 records.

In future we will see that records are kept to conform to your regulations, so that information can be given you accurately and with dispatch.
