4 p.m. blowing strong, single reefed the main and fore-sails choppy sea.

9 a.m. moderating out reefs.

3 p.m. came in fresh breeze from N.W.

6.30 p.m. hove to under the fore-sail, 6 miles from port Ogi-no-hama.

Boist breeze from N.W.
