

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 1923-37.

December 20, 1922.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, Libby, McNeill & Libby, whose home office is at Seattle, Washington, is hereby authorized to operate its plant for the salting of salmon for commercial purposes at Igushik, within Zone Two of the Bristol Bay district of the said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. No gill-net boats or fishing gear is allowed for the Igushik saltery as it is regarded as subsidiary to the Nushagak cannery.
2. That in view of the limitation on apparatus of the company no limit is set on the pack of this saltery for the season of 1923.
3. That the company shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.
4. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.

A permit, No. 37-1923, having been granted to Libby, McNeill and Libby under date of December 20, 1922, for the operation of its plant for the salting of salmon at Igushik within Zone Two of the Bristol Bay district of the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation during the calendar year 1923, in which permit it was stated that no gill-net boats or fishing gear were allowed for the Igushik cannery as it was regarded as subsidiary to the Nushagak cannery, information has been submitted to the Department showing that the Igushik saltery is operated as a separate unit and is not subsidiary to any other plant of this company. An allotment of ten (10) gill-net boats, each boat carrying not to exceed two hundred (200) fathoms of gill net, is therefore made for the Igushik saltery in the calendar year 1923.
