

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 1923-44.

Alaska Packers Association.
Kasilof, Diamond "CI" Cannery.

December 20, 1922.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, the Alaska Packers Association, whose home office is at San Francisco, California, is hereby authorized to operate its Diamond "CI" plant for the canning and salting of salmon for commercial purposes at Kasilof, within the Cook Inlet district of the said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That the company may operate ten (10) traps driven on the following sites: On the easterly shore of Cook Inlet - 4 traps between Cape Ninilchik and the mouth of the Kasilof River, 2 traps between the mouths of the Kasilof and Kenai Rivers, and 3 traps between the mouth of the Kenai River and Boulder Point; and 1 trap at Tyonek on the westerly shore of Cook Inlet; all the above as listed in the application of the company dated December 7, 1922, except that the trap heretofore driven on the eastern shore of Kalgin Island shall be discontinued. No gill-net licenses will be issued to the company, but fish may be purchased of any individuals obtaining permits to fish for salmon.

2. That the pack of all species of salmon shall not exceed forty thousand (40,000) cases, computed upon the basis of 48 one-pound cans per case.

3. That the company shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

4. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
