

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 62-1923.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, the Kodiak Fisheries Company, whose home office is at Seattle, Washington, is hereby authorized to operate its plant for the canning or salting of salmon and the salting of herring for commercial purposes at Kodiak, within Zone Three of the Kodiak-Afognak district of the said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That the company may operate seven (7) gill nets in Kiliuda Bay, Ugak Bay, and Kupreanof Straits, and may operate nineteen (19) beach seines in the following locations: Sitkalidak Strait, Kiliuda Bay, Ugak Bay, Kalsin Bay, Middle Bay, Women's Bay and St. Paul Harbor, Mill Bay, and Kupreanof Strait; but this permit does not include Uganik, Viskoda and Terror Bays. One trap may be driven in the company's old location near Old Harbor, Sitkalidak Strait, but the new traps requested in Sitkalidak Strait and Kiliuda Bay are for the present denied. Purse seines for capture of salmon are not permitted within the reservation. Fishing permits within the Afognak Forest and Fish Culture Reserve will be granted only to natives, in accordance with regulations now in force, and natives fishing within the Afognak Reservation have unrestricted privilege to sell to any purchaser the proceeds of their fishery.

2. That the pack of all species of salmon shall not exceed forty thousand (40,000) cases, computed upon the basis of 48 one-pound cans per case.

3. That the company shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

4. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
