PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 8-1923,
John Leiren,
Kamishak Bay and Kachemak Bay.

April 10, 1923.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, John Leiren, whose post office address is Seldovia, Alaska, is hereby authorized to engage in commercial fishing for salmon in Kamishak Bay, and for salmon, herring, and codfish in Kachemak Bay, within the Cook Inlet district of said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That the permittee may operate one 90-fathom beach seine in Kamishak Bay, in the vicinity of Little Kamishak River; and in Kachemak Bay may fish on a small scale for herring and codfish, and may catch and prepare 3,000 salmon, (chum, coho, and humpback) to be utilized for fox and dog feed and other commercial purposes. Salmon, herring, and codfish may be sold to any company or individual authorized to operate within the Cook Inlet district of said reservation. Purse seines used in the taking of herring shall not be employed for the taking of salmon within the reservation.

2. That the permittee shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation, (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

3. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
