

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE  
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 83-1923.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, Theo. Breyer and A. C. Freund, whose home office is at Seattle, Washington, is hereby authorized to operate a plant for the salting of herring and codfish at Chadarack Bay, on the southeastern end of Raspberry Island, within the Kodiak-Afognak district of said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That the permittees may operate one purse seine for the catching of herring in any of the waters of the Kodiak-Afognak district, provided that all fishing within the Afognak Forest and Fish Culture Reserve shall be carried on only by native Aleut or other aboriginal residents who have the privilege of fishing within the Afognak Reservation. No restriction is imposed as to the amount of herring and codfish that may be prepared.

2. That this permit does not grant any right to fish for or can salmon within the reservation.

3. That the permittees shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

4. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
