PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN
THE SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. Cordova 99-1923,
William H. Boll,
Harvester Island, Uyak Bay.

May 26, 1923.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, William H. Boll, whose post office address is Uyak, Alaska, and who is conducting a fox farm on Harvester Island, at the entrance to Uyak Bay, is hereby authorized to engage in commercial fishing for salmon and codfish in Uyak Bay, and the waters adjacent thereto between Cape Ugat and Cape Uyak, within Zone 1, of the Kodiak-Afognak District, of said reservation, during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That the permittee may operate 100 fathoms of gill net, for the taking of salmon for fox feed and other commercial purposes. Fresh salmon may be sold to any company or purchaser authorized to operate within Zone 1, but may not be sold or transported outside of said zone.
2. That the permittee may operate three codfish hand lines for catching and preparing a small amount of dry cod or stock fish.
3. That the permittee shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation, (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.
4. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
