PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE ALASKA
PENINSULA FISHERIES RESERVATION SHUMIGAN ISLANDS DISTRICT

Permit No. 55-W-1923
N. H. Johnson.

A reservation designated as the Alaska Peninsula Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of February 17, 1922, N. H. Johnson, whose post office address is Sand Point, Alaska, is hereby authorized to engage in the catching and salting of codfish and salmon at his station located at Snug Harbor, Unga Island, within the Shumagin district of the said reservation during the calendar year 1923, under the following conditions:

1. That fishing for salmon may be carried on by means of one half purse seine in the following waters. Ten thousand salmon to be taken in Popof Straits apportioned as follows, - seven thousand five hundred (7500) at Red Cove and two thousand five hundred (2500) in Squaw Harbor plus eighteen thousand five hundred (18500) to be taken in West Nagai Straits, the northwestern limits of which shall be fixed by a line drawn from Popof Head to Kellys Rock and oceanward but excluding the waters of Acheredin Bay.

2. That the permittee shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

3. That this permit expires December 31, 1923, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce, and subsequent permits will be granted only after the applicant has made a detailed report of the previous seasons operations to the Secretary of Commerce.
