

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
SOUTHWESTERN ALASKA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 102-1924.

A reservation designated as the Southwestern Alaska Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of November 3, 1922, the Alaska Consolidated Fisheries, Inc., whose post office address is Chicago, Illinois, is hereby authorized to engage in fishing for herring and operate a plant for freezing and icing or otherwise preparing for market of salmon, herring, codfish, and halibut at Portlock, Port Chatham, within the Cook Inlet District of the said reservation during the calendar year 1924, under the following conditions:

1. Fishing for herring in the Cook Inlet District shall not be engaged in prior to June 1, 1924.
2. The use of purse seines in fishing for herring is prohibited at all times in Halibut Cove and Lagoon, including the waters within a line drawn from the light on Ismailof Island to the outermost point on Glacier Spit.
3. This permit covers the operation of a plant at Port Chatham for the cold storage and freezing or preparing for market by mild-curing or dry salting of salmon, cod, halibut, and sablefish which may be purchased from local fishermen who hold the necessary permits.
4. This permit does not grant any right to fish for salmon within the reservation.
5. The permittees shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.
6. This permit expires December 31, 1924, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
