PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE ALASKA PENINSULA FISHERIES RESERVATION SHUMAGIN ISLANDS DISTRICT.

Permit No. 4-W-1924.

A reservation designated as the Alaska Peninsula Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of February 17, 1922, Harry Olsen, whose post office address is Squaw Harbor, Alaska, is hereby authorized to engage in the catching of salmon for commercial purposes, within the Shumagin district of the said reservation during the calendar year 1924, under the following conditions.

1. That fishing for salmon may be carried on by means of one half purse seine in the following waters: Two thousand Five Hundred salmon, (2500) to be taken in Popof Straits in the vicinity of Red Cove, and Three Thousand Five Hundred (3500) salmon in the Acheredin Bay, plus Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (8250) salmon to be taken in West Nagai Straits.

2. That the permittee shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (Copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.

3. That this permit expires December 31, 1924, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce, and a new permit if granted in subsequent seasons will only be given consideration after the applicant has been found to have filed with the Secretary of Commerce a detailed account of the previous seasons operations.
