ALASKA PENINSULA FISHERIES RESERVATION

A reservation designated as the Alaska Peninsula Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of February 17, 1922, the Pacific American Fisheries, whose home office is at South Bellingham, Washington, is hereby authorized to engage in the catching and canning of salmon for commercial purposes at Port Moller, within the Port Moller district of the said reservation during the calendar year 1924, under the following conditions:

1. That the company may operate four purse-seine boats, between Port Moller and Cape Seniavin, and two traps on the same locations as driven in the season of 1923.
2. That in view of this limitation on apparatus no case limit is set on the pack of this cannery for the season of 1924.
3. That the company shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.
4. That this permit expires December 31, 1924, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
