

PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN FISHERY OPERATIONS WITHIN THE
ALASKA PENINSULA FISHERIES RESERVATION

Permit No. 73-1924.

Alaska Codfish Company.

Seven Stations, as follows:

Three on Unga Island.

One on Nagai Island.

Two on Sanak Island.

One on Unimak Island.

December 11, 1923.

A reservation designated as the Alaska Peninsula Fisheries Reservation having been created by the Executive Order of February 17, 1922, the Alaska Codfish Company, whose home office is at San Francisco, California, is hereby authorized to engage in the catching and salting of codfish for commercial purposes at seven stations located as follows: Three on Unga Island and one on Nagai Island, in the Shumagin District; and two on Sanak Island and one on Unimak Island in the Ikatan District, all the above within the Alaska Peninsula Fisheries Reservation, during the calendar year 1924, under the following conditions:

1. That this permit does not grant any right to fish for or prepare salmon for market.
2. That the company shall observe the existing laws and regulations for the protection of the fisheries of Alaska and for the administration of the said reservation (copies of which are attached hereto and the conditions of which are made a part of this permit), as well as those that may hereafter be enacted or promulgated for such purposes.
3. That this permit expires December 31, 1924, is not transferable, and is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Secretary of Commerce.
