

PERMIT FOR COLLECTING TROUT EGGS IN ALASKA

December 6, 1923.

To Whom It May Concern:

The Department of Fisheries and Game, State of Washington, Post Office address, Box 394, Seattle, Washington, is hereby authorized to collect trout eggs for fish-cultural operations in Eva Lake and its tributaries and outlet stream, Baranof Island, Alaska.

This permit shall be subject to the following conditions and restrictions:

1. No weirs, except such as are specifically authorized and supervised by the Bureau of Fisheries, shall be maintained in the (tributaries of Eva Lake) or its outlet stream during the period when salmon are entering said waters to spawn.
2. A total of fifteen (15) per cent of the eyed eggs resulting from the total collection of eggs in any calendar year shall be reserved for delivery at the hatchery to the Bureau of Fisheries and the Alaska Territorial Fish Commission for stocking Territorial waters. At least twenty (20) days advance notice of the date on which the said reserve of eyed eggs will be ready for delivery shall be given to the representative of the Bureau of Fisheries at Juneau and to the Chairman of the Alaska Territorial Fish Commission. If neither the Bureau of Fisheries nor the Alaska Territorial Fish Commission accept delivery of the reserved eggs within ten (10) days after the date for delivery specified in the notice, they shall revert to the permittee for such use as it may elect.
3. No operations of the permittee shall interfere in any way with salmon or salmon fry in the waters covered by this permit.
4. All operations on the part of the permittee in connection with this permit shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the representative of the Bureau of Fisheries in charge of its activities in southeastern Alaska. Operations must at all times be conducted in accordance with any instructions that may be issued by the said representative of the Bureau of Fisheries or by the Commissioner of Fisheries.
5. The permittee shall keep the Bureau of Fisheries through its Juneau office fully informed in regard to its current operations and shall furnish any additional information that may be called for from time to time.

6. Inasmuch as the proposed operations are to be carried on within a National Forest it shall be incumbent upon the permittee to make with the proper representative of the Forest Service any arrangements that may be necessary in regard to use of land, timber or other resources within the reservation.

7. This permit expires December 31, 1924. If desired by the permittee, it will be renewed from year to year in the absence of any law or regulation to the contrary, provided that a renewal at the end of any year shall not be deemed by the Secretary of Commerce to be detrimental to the fisheries of Alaska. Any failure to observe the requirements of this permit shall be sufficient grounds for its revocation by the Secretary of Commerce at any time.
