

REPORT OF EXAMINATION OF ALASKA SALMON STREAM

Name of stream, Chiak Bay Salmon Stream. Date examined, August 10, 1926.

Location Chiak Bay, Admiralty Island.

Approximate length  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles. Width 55 feet. Depth 12 inches

Condition and stage (Whether clear, high, low, etc.)

Lakes, if any, size, character, and whether accessible from sea. No lakes.

Salmon run (heavy, light, average, etc.) Above average.

Date and duration of run of each species. Dog salmon began running July 10, and the run is still going on. A light run of humpbacks began July 31.

Estimated number of each kind of salmon on spawning beds or in stream.

I would estimate the number of dog salmon on spawning grounds and in streams to be between 30,000 and 45,000, and about 2000 humpbacks.

Former size of runs of each species and evidence of depletion, if any.

No evidence of depletion. I estimated last year's run of dog salmon to about 3,000 humpbacks. They had not started to run last year at this time.

Natural barriers and whether removable. There are no barriers.

Where markers are placed. About 1200 yards from mouth of stream.
