Remarks, sketches, etc. This stream was again examined by L. M. Johnson, stream-guard at Klawock Creek weir on September 30 while on special patrol duty in that area. He reported very few Pinks and Chums in stream at that time. Is believed this stream had a poor Chum seeding this season; with Pinks, it was a little better.
