


REPORT OF EXAMINATION OF ALASKA SALMON STREAM

Name of stream **North & South Arms of Hood Bay.** Date examined **October 16, 1929.**
Location **Hood Bay**

Approximate length **3 miles.** Width **20 feet** Depth **3 feet**

Condition and stage (whether clear, high, low, etc.) **Clear**

Lakes, if any, size, character, and whether accessible from sea **No Lake.**

Salmon run (heavy, light, average, etc.) **Heavy**

Date and duration of run of each species **Heavy run of humpbacks and chums started September 1. Run of chums continued up until this date.**

Estimated number of each kind of salmon on spawning beds, or in stream **To my estimation there has been no difference in the run of humpbacks and chums. There is from 50-75,000 fish in these streams.**

Former size of runs of each species and evidence of depletion, if any **To my estimation there is an increase of former runs.**

Natural barriers and whether removable **Not any.**

Where markers are placed **500 yards from mouth of stream.**
