


REPORT OF EXAMINATION OF ALASKA SALMON STREAM

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE
BUREAU OF FISHERIES



Name of stream **Three-Mile-Arm Creek** Date examined **Aug. 23, 1930 (and other times)**
Location **Running into Three Mile Arm from the north, about 3 miles from head of arm.**

Approximate length **7 miles** Width **20 ft.** Depth **9 in.**
(Water at time of last examination)
Condition and stage (whether clear, high, low, etc.) **Clear with a brownish tinge.**

Lakes, if any, size, character, and whether accessible from sea

Salmon run (heavy, light, average, etc.) **Salmon run heavier than last year.**

Date and duration of run of each species **Pinks and chums first escaped August 12; run of pinks and chums not yet ended. Escapement of cohos not yet begun.**

Estimated number of each kind of salmon on spawning beds, or in stream

About 25,000 pinks and 4,000 chums on spawning beds in lower 3 miles of creek.

Former size of runs of each species and evidence of depletion, if any **Last year run of pinks only about one-half as heavy as this year; last season's run of chums about the same as this year.**

Natural barriers and whether removable **No natural barriers as far up as creek has been explored, except a 3-ft. fall about 2 miles from mouth of stream. If water in creek medium high, salmon have no difficulty escaping ove fall.**

Where markers are placed **1,000 yards from mouth of creek.**
