Name of stream **Two Streams** Date examined **Sept. 9, 1933**

Location **W. arm- Head of Warmchuck Bay**
Each stream same size and almost same location

Approximate length **2 miles** Width **30'** Depth **6"**

Condition and stage (whether clear, high, low, etc.) **Clear-Low**

Lakes, if any, size, character, and whether accessible from sea **No lakes**

Salmon run (heavy, light, average, etc.) **Very Light**

Date and duration of run of each species **Aug. 15 to Sept. 15**

Estimated number of each kind of salmon on spawning beds, or in stream

No salmon of any kind in either stream. About 1000 Pinks outside mouth.

Former size of runs of each species and evidence of depletion, if any **Normal escapement in these streams should be 30,000 salmon**

Natural barriers and whether removable **Many windfalls and log jams but none that would prevent salmon from going up.**

Where markers are placed **500 yds. from mouths.**

Remarks, sketches, etc. **The streams in warmchuck were heavily fished years ago when Swift, Arthur Crosby cannery was operated in the bay.**
