

Stream No. 10 (No notice) West head McClure Bay
Several small streams enter a lagoon here. None of them
accessible more than 500 feet above high tide line.
The bottom of all of them is fine gravel.
August 18, 1927: 4,000 fish.

Stream No. 10A (1 notice) West head McClure Bay.
Is 30 feet wide and 4 inches deep.
Is accessible 150 feet above high tide line.
Has a fine shallow bar at mouth, balance coarse gravel
and boulders.
August 18, 1927: only 100 in stream; 2,000 in bay near it.

Stream No. 11 (1 notice) Near entrance Blue Fiord.
Is 15 feet wide and 6 inches deep.
Has a falls about 200 feet back from high tide line. Too
high for fish to ascend.
About 800 feet of stream bed exposed at half tide. Fine
gravel bottom.
August 18, 1927: 1,200 fish.

Stream No. 12 (2 notices) North side Port Nellie Juan.
Is 18 feet wide and 6 inches deep.
Has a medium coarse gravel bottom for a distance of 1,000
feet, then it is rough, blocky rocks.
Accessible for fish for at least 1/2 mile.
Salt water shallow at mouth.
Aug. 9, 1924: Lots of fish here.
July 30, 1926: 2,000 fish.
Aug. 17, 1927: 3,340 fish.

Stream No. 12A (1 notice)
Is 10 feet wide and 3 inches deep.
Fine gravel bed at mouth.
Accessible 1,500 feet.
Aug. 18, 1927: 9,560 fish.
