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Stream No. 24 (1 notice) Anderson Bay

Is 15 feet wide and 10 inches deep.

Has a fine gravel bottom and spreads out to a width of 60 feet at its junction with salt water.

Level country upstream.

Is accessible more than 1 mile.

Sept. 11, 1927.....8,900 fish.

Stream No. 25 (1 notice) Anderson Bay

20 feet wide and 6 inches deep.

Slow current.

Has good fine gravel bottom.

It spreads out into three parts where it enters salt water.

It has good gravel bars and is wide at mouth.

It enters a shallow lagoon.

Is accessible $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Sept. 11, 1927 visit.....4,100 fish.

Stream No. 26 (2 notices)

There is a long, narrow lagoon here. It is shallow, and only 2 feet water in entrance on a 9-foot tide at high water.

It measures at head of lagoon 10 feet wide and 5 inches deep.

Only 20 humps here dead and alive Aug. 28, 1926.

Has a rough, bare, broken rock bottom.

No estimate 1927.

Stream No. 27 (No marker) Shelter Bay

The main stream here is glacier and only has about 100 fish in it. Lagoon here.

There are 2 other small clear-water ones. Only one of them has a rough, rocky bottom, and is very small. There were 300 fish all told in it.

The other one has good bottom. It is small too.

600 fish for it. 1,200 fish dead and alive would cover all Aug. 28, '26.

Allowed for this '27.
