Location Jakobi Island.

Approximate length 3 miles. Width 15 feet Depth 8 inches.

Condition and stage (Whether clear, high, low, etc.) Green, slimy, low.

Lakes, if any, size, character, and whether accessible from sea. Large lake.

Salmon run (heavy, light, average, etc.) About $\frac{1}{2}$ as many as in 1923.

Date and duration of run of each species. From 20th of July to the 11th of August and later. All sockeyes.

Estimated number of each kind of salmon on spawning beds or in stream. Very few.
The Inner lagoon is full of fish, but stream is too low.

Former size of runs of each species and evidence of depletion, if any. In 1923 the river was twice as large.

Natural barriers and whether removable. Dry weather.

Where markers are placed. 1500 feet from Narrows to Inner lagoon.

Remarks, sketches, etc. The Inner Bay should be closed to fishing, especially gill netting.
