

Stream No. 1

Bay of Isles.

Red stream and a small lake.

Oct. 4, 1925: 50 live reds here. 5,000 for bay,--humps

Aug. 31, 1927: 15 live reds in lake and no dead ones in sight;
200 humps and 25 silvers at mouth.Stream No. 2 (No marker)

West side Herring Bay, Knight Island.

Width: 5 feet

Depth: 3 inches.

Accessible in wet weather 6,000 feet,--less in a dry season.

Has a rough, rocky bed with a little coarse gravel in deep holes.

Good gravel and shallow water around mouth.

Aug. 9, 1926: 2,000 fish (alive and dead) in stream, all in deep
holes,--25 to 100 in a hole; 2,500 around mouth; and
1,500 a short distance along the beach.

Aug. 24, 1927: 4,300 fish.

Stream No. 3 (2 notices)

South side Ewan Bay.

Width: 20 feet

Depth: 5 inches

Accessible about 1/4 mile

Has a rather coarse gravel bottom,--good fine gravel at mouth.

Has shallow salt water for quite a distance off high tide mouth.

Aug. 7, 1924: 16,000 fish

July 29, 1925: 5,000 fish

Aug. 4, 1926: 2,000 fish

Aug. 25, 1927: 6,230 fish

Stream No. 4 (No notice)

Enters the lagoon at head of Ewan Bay.

Width: 15 feet

Depth: 8 inches

Accessible 1/2 mile, then high falls.

Lagoon has a bad entrance. Can be entered only at high, slack
water, and then only with a skiff. Stream has good coarse gravel
bottom.
