WINTER WEATHER IN EASTERN CANADA

Regions cool enough to attract the summer vacationist can often also meet the requirements of the lover of winter sports. The St. Lawrence valley is noted for its abundant snowfall which reaches an average of 10 feet a winter in some regions. Moreover, its winter climate is, in some respects, an equable one, for it lacks the excessive cold usually associated with regions which are ice-bound and snow-bound five months of the year, while at the same time winter warm spells are rarely sufficiently pronounced to make travelling uncomfortable either from softness under foot or from too much warmth in winter clothing. In fact, the winter climate of eastern Canada is often the subject of enthusiastic comment on the part of visitors.
