Midwinter weather and the home garden! January is usually the month of greatest cold, and for most of the country work in the home garden is confined to carefully planning on paper the garden for the next season using, of course, the experiences gained from the past seasons for guidance. It is the time to order seeds, fertilizer and new tools, and to clean, repair and sharpen the old ones. In the south, however, smooth peas and broad beans may be planted as soon as the ground is in condition to work. Radishes and lettuce may be sown late in the month. And in the extreme south potatoes may be planted. Also set out onions sets.
