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Snowfalls of the past and future! How often one hears of the good, old-fashioned winters. A study of stations with long records, say 100 years, show that "hard" and "soft" winters and winters of heavy and light snow have been, in the long run, equally distributed. There may have been a series of hard winters for ten years, and there may have been a soft one in the middle of that period. The point is that the first 50 years would average about the same as the last 50. How about the new-fashioned winter? There is every reason to believe that it will be much like those of the past 100 years, so far as averages are concerned; but individual records of snow and temperature may be broken.
