The home gardener! Temperatures will be high enough this month to promote plant growth. The gardener in the North, having done his preliminary work last month, may make hotbeds and cold frames, sow tomato, eggplant, cauliflower, cabbage and pepper seeds in hotbeds, or, lacking these, in boxes in the house. Radishes and lettuce planted in hotbeds may mature there. Asparagus beds may be fertilized. When ground is ready to work, he may sow seeds of spinach, radishes, early peas, beets, onion sets and lettuce. He may dig, before they begin to grow, parsnips and salsify left in the ground over the winter. In the South it is time to plant tall wrinkled peas and all the hardier vegetables, and late in the month, string beans.
