Tornadoes vs. floods! Which would you rather live in, tornado or flood country? Statistics show that on the average more lives are claimed by tornadoes than by floods, but that the latter causes more property damage. People, through the warnings of the Weather Bureau, are forewarned of coming floods, and have time to escape to higher ground. But tornadoes are difficult to forecast, so that this respite is not given. When people are outdoors and can see them approach, there is frequently time enough to save themselves and give timely warning to those within doors. Sometimes, however, tornadoes may sweep across the country catching people unawares and thus cause the loss of many lives.
