Auto touring and snow! Many people tour in automobiles throughout the year. In the winter most of the main roads are kept open, but many of the less frequented roads may still have snow on them. The southern limit of snow on the ground is well north of the Ohio River. Southern New England is bare, as is most of the country south of the Great Lakes. The ground is bare of snow along the Pacific coast eastward to the foothills, of course. The greatest depths of snow are in the Sierra and Cascade ranges in Washington, Oregon, and California, and in the mountains of Idaho, Wyoming and Colorado. From 20 to 30 inches of snow cover Upper Michigan and Maine, and less amounts in other parts of the northern states.
