Phenology! This science should appeal to all lovers of nature who like to observe and record how plant and animal life respond to the changes of the weather. Those who detest tables will find their diaries very suitable places for their nature notes. The observer should confine himself (or herself) to a few well-known species of plants, birds and insects, including spiders. Note the dates of the flowering of plants which grow in an average good place; the first appearance of the insects, and dates when birds are first and last seen or heard. These notations may be enhanced by suitable word descriptions of the responses of plant and animal life in your locality to the local changes in weather.
