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The "eye" of the storm! Almost pleasant weather in the center or "eye" of the terrible tropical cyclone (hurricane) has been experienced by the few navigators who have passed through them and come out alive. Hurricanes are about to commence now, but reach their greatest frequency in September. The "eye" averages only about 14 miles wide, where sometimes the skies are clear or at most very slight drizzles occur. But outside of them the greatest winds of the whole storm area are measured. These winds are often over 100 miles per hour and there are records of 160. These speeds indicate the origin of the word "hurricane" which means, in Indian, "big wind."

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
