Superlative weather! We have here in America not the greatest extremes in the world but a wide enough diversity to suit anybody. Our temperature range is from 134 degrees in Death Valley, Calif., to 67 degrees below zero in Yellowstone Park. And in rainfall we have the greatest variety as far as amounts go averaging from only two inches in southwestern Arizona to 130 inches in northwest Oregon where there are 180 days of rain a year. Humidity varies with rainfall as a rule. The most humid parts of the country are the Pacific and Gulf coasts with over 80 per cent., while in southwest Arizona relative humidity as low as two per cent. has been measured.
