Fishing weather! An old fisherman once wrote: "If there were no bass, he would go for trout; if there were no trout, he would go for bass; but if both were available, he would go crazy." We can go for trout now that all the ice is out the streams. Good fishermen catch fish in all kinds of weather. Some say use small flies for trout in clear weather, and large flies on dull days. Generally trout bite best in the cool of the day. Good old Isak Walton does not think much of north or east wind for fishing, but for the others he says:

"When the wind is in the south,  
It blows the flies in the fish's mouth;  
When the wind is in the west,  
There it is the very best.
