Garden calendar! Curiously enough there is in this last month of spring in the northern latitudes a chance of cold weather, called the "May freeze." It occurs when a cold mass of Canadian air comes down from the north, but it hardly ever does any damage to crops. In the North sow tender vegetables such as cucumbers, melons, squashes, lima beans, and tomatoes in the open. Transplant celery. About every ten days plant corn; also broccoli, Brussels sprouts, leeks, eggplant and pepper plants. Tomatoes may be safely set out in the end of month in extreme North and earlier farther south. In the South, continue sowing beets, beans and corn for successive crops. Celery seed may be sown for a late crop. Set out sweet potatoes near end of month.
