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Ocean travel! Those who are thinking about crossing the Atlantic can pick out no better month than June. A voyage during that month is not likely to be attended by weather discomfort. In the North Atlantic the weather will be generally quiet and pleasant; gales are rare in June. Fog over the Grand Banks, off Newfoundland, may be expected about 20 days out of the month. In the South Atlantic, June marks the beginning of the hurricane season. However, hurricanes are not only very rare in June but also not severe, as a rule, only ten intense hurricanes having been recorded in June from 1887 to 1936. -----
